## Federal and State Environmental Policy Acts



National Environmental Policy Act of 1970 (NEPA)

Minnesota Environmental Policy Act of 1973 (MEPA)

#### **Environmental Review**

- Regulatory program that implements federal and/or state policy
- Applies to some future projects
- Public disclosure of all potential environmental effects in one document
- Informs government approvals



#### General environmental review characteristics


- Required public process
- Broader in scope that permitting (includes all potential environmental effects in one document)
- Moratorium on final approvals and construction
- Projects do not pass or fail environmental review not an approval process


## Examples of benefits

- Provides information during project design phase
- Provides information beyond individual permit compliance
- Provides information for public participation in project approvals



## Who implements environmental review






## Federal Environmental Review Program

- Oversight by the Council on Environmental Quality
- Review major actions of federal governmental agencies that may significantly affect the environment
- Each agency develops implementing procedures
- "Rule of Reason" decision criteria



## State Environmental Review Programs

- 16 state environmental review programs
- Limited to state approval decisions
- Similar outcomes
- Different procedures



## Minnesota's Environmental Review Program

Minnesota Statute 116C

 Created the Environmental Quality Board

Minnesota Statute 116D Minnesota Environmental Policy Act

 Gives the Board authority to adopt rules

Minnesota Rules Chapter 4410

 Implements the Environmental Review (ER) Program established by statute

## Historic Environmental Review Program framework

#### 1973-1977

- Procedures for review established through rules
- All decision-making authority was centralized under the EQB.
- EQB decided on a case-by-case basis which projects required review

#### 1977 Amendments

- Delegated authority to include other government agencies to decide which projects required review
- Decisions were subject to review and reversal by the EQB

# Current Environmental Review Program framework (1982 Amendments)

- Delegated authority for implementing procedures to other state and local government agencies
- Established mandatory categories of project types and thresholds;
   exemptions
- Alternative review option
- Appeals directly to courts (not EQB)

## Minnesota's Environmental Review Program



## EQB authorities



- Pass rules to improve Program effectiveness
- Approve administrative requests
- Approve forms
- Approve alternative types of review
- Publish required notices in the EQB Monitor

- Decision criteria

#### **EQB**



- Monitor Program effectiveness
- Provide assistance for understanding the rules
- Create guidance

- Implement procedures
- Prepare environmental documents
- Decision maker


Provide project details

- Review environmental documents
- Provide comments

## When is review required?



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## Public request for review: Petition process

- Formalized process to request preparation of an Environmental Assessment Worksheet
  - Requires material evidence of potential environmental effects
  - Must be signed by at least 100 individuals who live or own property in Minnesota
- Petition submitted to EQB
- EQB designates RGU



## When is review exempt?

#### Environmental Review does <u>not</u> apply when:

- No government decisions are required
- All government decisions have been made
- Any required government approval has been denied
- A substantial portion of the project is complete
- The environmental review process has been completed

**Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)** 

Alternative Urban Areawide Review (AUAR)




#### **Content:**

- 6-page worksheet
- 20 standardized questions
- Discloses information necessary to decide if an EIS is needed

## EAW process timeline




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#### EIS need decision

- Type, extent, and reversibility
- Cumulative potential effects
- The extent to which the environmental effects are subject to mitigation
- The extent to which environmental effects can be anticipated and controlled

#### EIS

- More in-depth
- Alternatives
- Environmental, economic & social
- Mitigation of impacts



#### **AUAR**



#### Alternative review process


- Used instead of an individual project EAW or EIS
- Defined geographic area
- 5-year expiration/Can be updated
- Limited to residential, commercial, warehousing, and light industrial development and associated infrastructure


