
Goals for program

Program adjustments – SIETF


Better relationship with LGU implementers

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Rule Changes - 2010

Judge's report now available on MPCA website and the OAH website

Several procedural steps to complete

Judge approval of 'order to adopt'

MPCA Board – December or January

Final by April 4, 2011 as required by legislature

Impact on Ordinances

MPCA will meet legislative deadline 20 counties already amended ordinances

Assess if further changes needed to meet new rule – many will need no more work

If so, must be completed by two years after the effective date of the MPCA rules

Remaining counties have until February 4, 2012 to adopt the 2010 rule
