## **General County Highlights**

#### **COUNTY PROGRAM AID**

\$80 million/year increase.

Local Housing and Public Safety aid.

#### **PILT**

Over \$20 million biennial increase.

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

Gas tax indexing, tab fees, MVST, delivery fee, auto parts sales tax dedication.

#### **CAPITAL INVESTMENT**

\$2.6 billion (\$1 billion in cash left on the table).

 Solid Waste, Roads and Bridges, Wetland replacement.

#### HOUSING

\$1 billion affordable and workforce housing rental assistance, and shelter capital.

#### **CORRECTIONS**

\$43 million in new funding.

#### **BROADBAND**

\$100 million (\$40 million for low population density program).

#### **PUBLIC HEALTH**

\$9.844 million system funding, \$8.4 million emergency response and preparation.



## **Environment & Energy Omnibus Bill**

#### **PFAS**

- Product prohibitions (2025), use reporting (2026), full ban by 2032.
- Water standards and Health Risk Limits.



#### **CERVIDAE FARMS**

- Prohibition on new white tail farms.
- Oversight to DNR.
- Live animal testing, fencing, escaped animal, importation, and liability.



# **ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE**

- Cumulative air pollution impacts.
- Air permit hearings.
- Air emissions toxins reporting.

# RESOURCE MANAGEMENT STUDY

Feasibility and costs to achieve 90% reduction of disposal by 2045.

#### **STATE LANDS '22**

St. Louis, Freeborn Beltrami, Cass, Crow Wing, Fillmore, Goodhue, Hennepin, Itasca, Pine, and Sherburne Counties.

- TFL leases may be up to 25 years in length, increases public sale threshold to \$50,000 per year.
- Allows for conservation easements on county TFL.

#### **STATE LANDS '23**

St. Louis, Itasca, Beltrami, Goodhue, Aitkin, Crow Wing, Becker, Kandiyohi, Koochiching, and Sherburne Counties.

#### **SOLAR END-OF-LIFE STUDY**

#### **SOLAR ON PUBLIC BUILDINGS**

\$5 million

# CLIMATE PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS

\$5 million

#### **COMMUNITY SOLAR GARDENS**

New program remains at 5MW, capacity capped annually.

#### **HOA SOLAR RESTRICTIONS**

Prevents HOA's from restricting solar installations, but local ordinances still apply.

# LEGAL POSSESSION AND HOME GROWING

Begins August 1, 2023

#### **RETAIL SALES**

Likely to begin 1st quarter 2025

# OFFICE OF CANNABIS MANAGEMENT (OCM)

- Rulemaking to set water, energy, solid waste and odor standards.
- 15 different licenses, must verify local compliance before issuing.
- Model ordinances, forms and procedures, and compliance checks.

#### **LOCAL CONTROLS**

May not prohibit, but may adopt reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of a cannabis business.

#### LIMITING RETAILERS

One for every 12,500 residents, 1000 ft from schools, 500ft from daycares, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic field.

#### **TAXES**

10% tax,20% for local governments,50% counties -20 even/80 based on licenses.

#### **SCORE 3% transfer SWMT:**

- \$6.9 million ('24-'25)
- \$7.3 million ('26-'27)

#### **AGRICULTURE**

#### **Noxious Weeds Grants:**

Increase \$300,000 (24-25)

**Broadband:** \$100 million

\$40 million for low density program (75% of project)

#### **CAPITAL INVESTMENT**

\$2.6 billion, \$1.5 billion bonds, \$1.1 billion cash

- LRWRP: \$12 million,
- Five Solid Waste Projects: \$53.728 million

#### **LEGACY**

- Comprehensive Watershed Plans: \$79 million
- SSTS Inspections and Low-income Grants: \$7.1 million
- Culvert Replacement: \$2 million
- Ag BMP Loan Program: \$9.598 million
