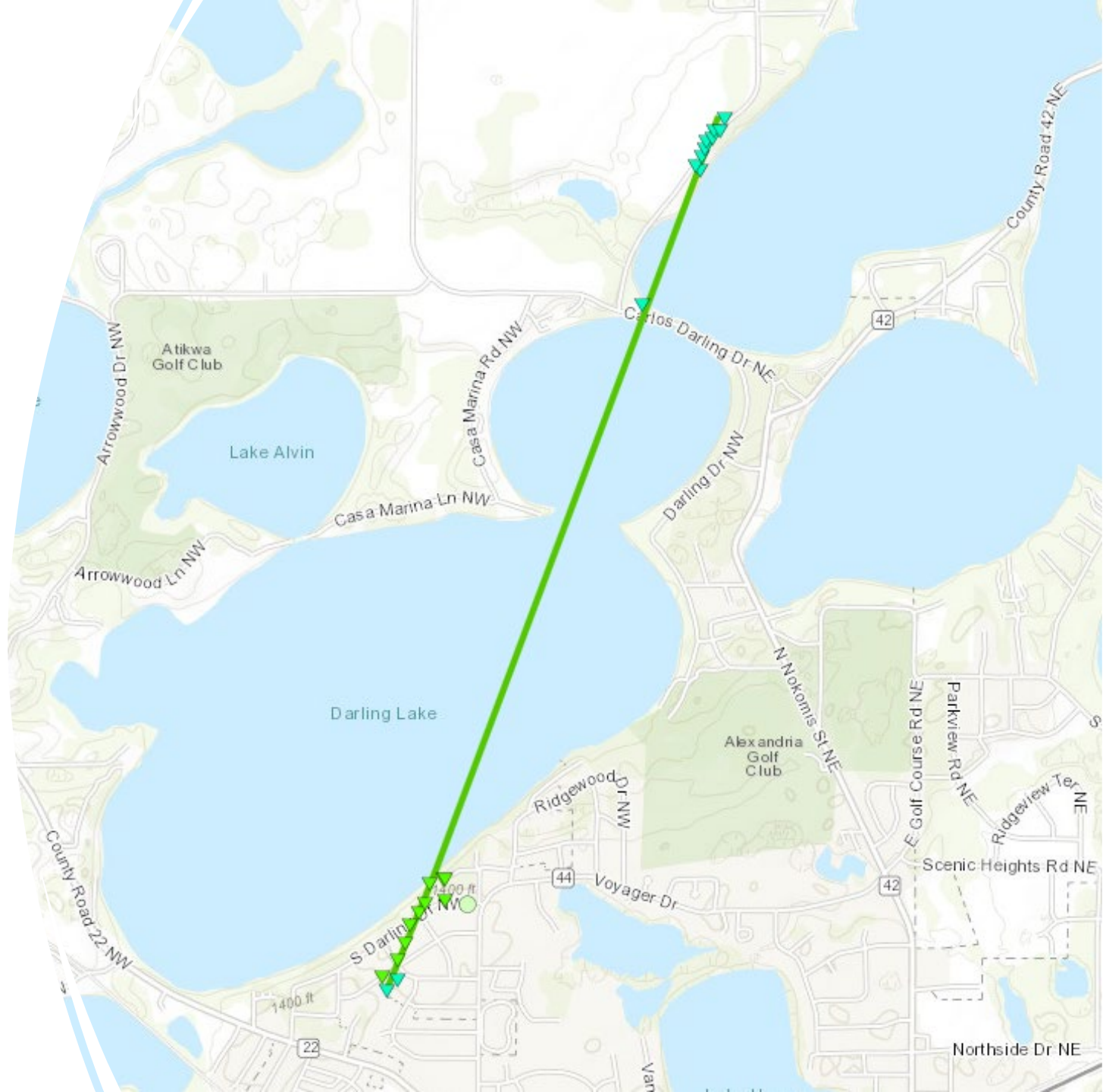

Douglas County Emergency Management

May 12

- Strong EF1
- Derecho Winds
- 9 homes destroyed and dozens more damaged
- Trees down
- Power outages





May 30

- EF 2 on the ground for nearly 20 miles
- 39 homes destroyed and dozens more damaged
- Trees down
- Tornado debris scattered as far as 500 feet out into Maple Lake

Response

- May 30
 - Multiple incident command posts initially
 - Week-long incident command post at Forada Fire Hall
 - Firefighters and first responders, emergency management, sheriff's office
 - American Red Cross
 - Salvation Army
 - Volunteers



Lake Clean Up

- Douglas County Land & Resource Management
- Douglas County Sheriff's Office
- Minnesota Pollution Control Agency
- Department of Natural Resources
- Demolition debris 120 cubic yards
- Mixed municipal solid waste 40 cubic yards
- Recyclable metals 60 cubic yards (2 tons)

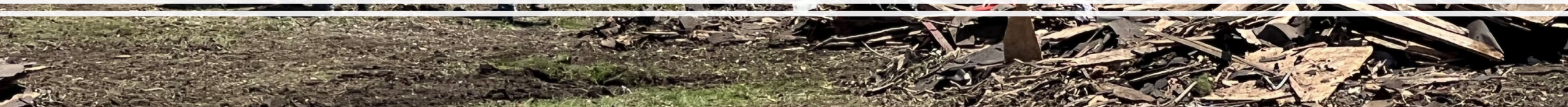
