






- Chapter 12: Emergency Management. (1951) (2015 DACA)

 Assistance; Absent Federal Aid. (2014)



Command & Coordination





Policy Group Roles and Responsibilities



- Coordinate policy <u>guidance</u> among department leadership regarding priorities and objectives based on situational needs and the emergency operations plan (EOP).
- Oversee resource coordination and <u>support</u> to the on-scene commander through the emergency operations center (EOC).

Typical Policy Group Issues

HSEME

- Information requirements.
- Emergency declaration.
- Resource allocations.
- Evacuations.
- Protection priorities.
- Recovery guidance and priorities.
- Request for disaster declaration.
- Key messages.



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Emergency Powers Under Local Declaration





- Invokes emergency operations plans.
- Authorizes powers to "fast provide emergency aid."
- Enter into contracts and incur obligations to protect health and safety and provide emergency assistance.
- Bypass compliance with time-consuming procedures and formalities for purchasing, contracting, employing temporary workers, renting equipment, etc.
- Expedite appropriation and expenditure of public funds, budget requirements, etc.
- Meets requirement for disaster declarations and National Guard support.

Types of Disaster Assistance



Public Assistance (PA)

- Repair, replacement, or restoration of disaster damaged publicly owned facilities.
- Federal and state.



Individual Assistance (IA)

- Disaster-related needs not covered by insurance for individuals, families, and small business owners.
- Federal only.*



Hazard Mitigation (HMA)

- 15% statewide.
- Projects to help eliminate or reduce the effects of future disasters
- Federal only.


Federal "Stafford Act" assistance (FEMA)



- 2023 state indicator: \$10,100,494
 - \$1.77 per capita
- 2023 Aitkin County indicator: \$69,694.68
 - \$4.44 per capita
- *75/25 federal/state (tribal) cost share

State "Chapter 12B" assistance (DPS)


- 2023 Aitkin County indicator: \$38,847.34
 - \$2.22 per capita
- 75/25 state/local or tribal cost share

State & Federal Disaster Assistance Process Flow



- Respond to event.
- Report scope of event.
- Declare local emergency.



- Submit initial damage and impact assessment (IDA).
- Request joint preliminary damage assessment (PDA).
- Conduct joint PDA(Results in "Table A").
- Request disaster assistance.
- President or Governor authorizes disaster assistance.
- Brief applicants and receive requests for public assistance (RPA).**
- Formulate and complete projects.
- Reimbursement of eligible expenses.
- Payment, closeout, and audit.
